## **Minutes**

Meeting called to order at 5:40.

Special guest Drew Sechrist of Koozoo did a presentation about his security company's product.

Historic Resources Survey: Rick Kurylo presented the final SFSU Planning Students Historic Resources survey Report. The designated all the buildings as significant, significant-supportive, or not significant. Members of the committee are encouraged to review their findings.

Weaver says once this is done we can take it to the planning department to show the validity of the project and have a legitimate historic preservation plan.

Make-up Festival: OAA/OMI-CPP Invest in Neighborhoods application for funding to have a spring festival at 270 Brighton St. tentatively on May 31 has been sent in. Panel will determine winners in late December. OAA will kick in \$1,000. Grant will bring in around \$9,000.

Executive Director's Report: Sidewalk Garden installation happened in mid-November. Got more than what we were budgeted for. Faxon lucked out. Also landscaped the Valero gas station planter. Holiday bows did not get enough volunteers. Weaver learned a District Design Guidelines project could be funded by MOEWD.

Public Comment: Mary Harris said she nominated the OAA for the best Merchant's Association/CBD for a Neighborhood Empowerment Network award.

Weaver asked the SFMTA on the WalkFirst Investment Strategy to come to the January 2014 meeting.

Favetti said there's permit to turn the former El Porvenir space into a sushi bistro and lounge. Comment period is from Dec. 10 to Jan. 10.

Al Harris asked Weaver to call the Walgreen's manager and tell him/her to clean the parking lot. Favetti's neighbor says Walgreens guard is taking license plate numbers. 1601 Ocean Avenue space will be a for-profit arts instruction business.
