Review and Approval of August Minutes

Gateway Sculpture Presentation, Eric Powell

Weaver: OAA must spend down \$50-60,000 on an arts project. Don't have enough money to do the Ocean-Phelan Sculpture as outlined in the Ocean and Geneva Design Study. Invited sculptor Eric Powell to speak about public art gateways.

Powell has been a sculptor for 28 years. Showed many sculptures he and his crew crafted for public entities across the Bay Area.

Winston suggested taking inspiration from the neighborhoods mixed street grids.

Two features of a successful gate to Powell: Function saying 'don't come in here' but it's not a fortress. And does signify and represent the place that is behind the gate.

Goal is to have the whole project done by December 2018.

OAA Staff will develop documentation about a project to replace the Ingleside Library gate.

Fix-It Team Tour Report, Dan Weaver and Luis Licea

PG&E contacted Weaver — after complaining to the Fix-It Team — about getting LED lights on the side streets.

Fix-It Team did not seem to think Brighton and Holloway was a problem.
